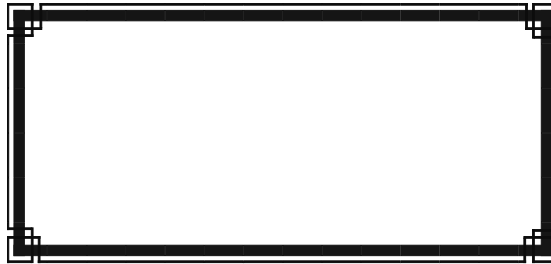

Tomosynthesis: Detecting More Cancers

Combining traditional digital mammography with tomosynthesis detects 90 percent more breast cancers than mammography alone. "Tomosynthesis and digital mammography is much more sensitive than digital mammography," principal investigator and radiologist Pierpaolo Pattacini, MD, told the Radiological Society of North America of his work, in which he and colleagues at AUSL Reggio Emilia hospital randomized nearly 20,000 women to either conventional screening or digital mammography plus digital breast tomosynthesis.

It has been an exciting month at Imaging for Women. Fox 4 News came to our facility to report about the self-compression option patients have when undergoing their screening mammograms. In case you were not aware, our GE Pristina mammogram units have a patient self-compression feature that allows the patient to slowly apply compression in a step wise manner. This helps to remove the anxiety associated with the compression portion of the exam and more often than not, results in patients using more compression than when a technologist applies the compression. This results in better images for the radiologist reading the exam and less dose to the patient. Patients also find the exam to be more comfortable than in prior years with most patients experiencing no pain at all.

The response to the story has been amazing. The morning after the story aired we had patients calling in from all over the metro area to schedule; some of whom had not had a mammogram in many years due to a previous unpleasant experience elsewhere. Every patient who came in and used the self-compression feature noted how different and vastly better the experience was, and everyone said they would be back next year. Some patients were even telling their friends before they left about our facility and their experience.
