Breast Cancer Awareness Month Is Here!

Imaging for Women is excited and ready for the beginning of our busiest time of year. Each October, the world is reminded about the importance of breast cancer screening almost everywhere they turn. We led into this important time of year celebrating those who have had to face the diagnosis of breast cancer with a party to celebrate their fighting spirit and the journey they have taken to become a breast cancer survivor. This was done at our annual Breast Cancer Survivors' Party on September 23 here at IFW. It was a wonderful day filled with inspirational stories, prize giveaways, a champagne toast, and a butterfly release. With another successful Survivors' Party behind us, we look forward to Breast Cancer Awareness Month. With the addition of Dr. Zupon, we now have two fellowship trained breast radiologists able to perform breast biopsies. This has increased our flexibility for scheduling these procedures and we are often able to perform them the same day if desired. Many physicians have taken advantage of this and patients are extremely grateful when we can complete the workup and biopsy in the same day. The addition of tomosynthesis and whole breast screening ultrasound has greatly improved our ability to detect breast cancer. Tomosynthesis has also helped reduce our call back rate. Most patients benefit from tomosynthesis over standard 2D mammography and those patients with dense breast tissue qualify for additional screening with whole breast ultrasound. If you or your patients have any questions about which exams are right for them, please feel free to contact us and one of our radiologists would be happy to discuss the best imaging option.

We would also like to remind everyone that we perform most general ultrasound exams on both men and women. If you have a patient that needs an ultrasound exam of abdomen, pelvis, thyroid, soft tissues, venous Doppler, or carotid arterial system, we would be happy to help with any of these imaging needs. Thanks to a physician who notified us of a mammography report problem, we fixed a problem in the statistical section of our reports which gives a woman's risk of future breast cancer. The numbers are based on the Gail model. The model isn't perfect, but it gives a woman and you some idea of her future risk of developing breast cancer. When we underwent an upgrade to our reporting model, one element of the calculation was changed so this corrupted the numbers generated.
